# Lord Mayor's Show & Lunch

## Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> November 2018

The Master and Wardens invite fellow Constructors and their partners, families and friends to join in the fun of one of the world's best loved pageants: The Lord Mayor's Show. Come and watch the longest, grandest, and most meticulously organised procession in the world go by (all three miles of it). The day is totally informal – just turn up! You only need to book if you wish to have lunch with us at the Little Ship Club (see below). Please note that there is no breakfast offering this year as there will not be a flotilla.

For the Lord Mayor's Show itself, the Constructors' spectating contingent traditionally views the procession from the south side of Cheapside in front of the church of **St Mary-le-Bow** (EC2V 6AU) – the church whose bells are credited with having persuaded Dick Whittington to turn back from Highgate some 620 years ago. **We gather here from 10am.** The head of the procession leaves Mansion House at 11am with the procession being gradually zipped together from three moving streams to create a single broad parade that will take over an hour to go past our vantage point. But from wherever Constructors view the show, all are invited to join together for lunch at the Little Ship Club, Bell Wharf Lane – courtesy of the City Livery Club.

**Constructors having lunch should plan to arrive at the Little Ship Club at around 12.30pm to sit down at 1 o'clock. As well as a cash bar, there will be complimentary tea and coffee available all afternoon while Constructors relax and socialise in the Club Room overlooking the Thames until it closes at 5pm.**

Dress code for lunch is smart casual, but those watching the procession should also dress for the weather!

**Places are limited and advance booking is required. **Lunch (£19.50) is a hot buffet of chicken chasseur with new potatoes & French beans followed by apple crumble with custard or cream;**

**Lunch for children (£10.50) is freshly made chicken burger with chips or fish and chips with peas.**

For those who would like to walk off their lunch, City Guides are offering free guided walks around the City (lasting around 90 minutes) at 3pm from No.1 Poultry. Constructors can then round off the day by heading out to Victoria Embankment to watch one of London's most spectacular free annual firework displays. Fireworks are set off at 5.15pm on the river between Blackfriars and Waterloo bridges.
