A FINAL MESSAGE FROM THE COMMANDING OFFICER

Commander Chris Chew, Royal Navy

August 2025 brings to an end Starboard Crew's final tour of duty in the Middle East on Operation KIPION. It also signals the end of the Forward Deployed model for HMS Lancaster, which has seen two crews (Port and Starboard) rotating on a four-monthly cycle since late 2022. This most recent rotation for Starboard has arguably been one of the most varied and challenging for our Sailors and Officers. So, as we prepare to handover to Port crew for the final time, I want to take a few moments to reflect on the achievements of the last four months.

We have continued our work disrupting the illicit narcotics and weapons trade, seizing almost £30m worth of drugs in May, a huge operational success for the whole Ship's Company. 'Inferno 2,' our Wildcat Flight, have achieved the highest number of flying hours seen in recent years, and when combined with our Peregrine flight we achieved a 24 hour, around the clock, deck cycle for over 3 weeks – which has never been seen before on a frigate or destroyer!

It is no secret that the Ship is at the end of her lifespan and our engineering teams continue to show exceptional drive and determination to keep us ready for operations, working hand-in-

glove with our Logistics department to extend our supply chain back to the UK. Despite these obstacles the crew has remained flexible and ready to respond; not least to the 12-day Israeli-Iran War and our subsequent tasking to protect, guard and reassure UK and US Ships in the region. Throughout my time as Commanding Officer our people in Lancaster have shown the best of the Royal Navy, not least in this final period, where the threat was real and uncertainty high. I am incredibly proud of the hard work, professionalism and bravery of the entire Ship's Company.

Our thoughts now turn to returning to the UK and re-joining friends and family. I would like to thank you for your continued support throughout the lifetime of the ship

MAINTAINING OUR AFFILIATE RELATIONSHIPS THROUGHOUT REGENERATION & BEYOND

Starboard crew began 2025 with their usual regeneration in HMS Nelson, a three-month long period of essential training, force generation and briefing to prepare for re-deployment. The Crew also used this time to foster partnerships with our affiliate organisations, hosting friends from the City of Lancaster, the Duchy of

Lancaster, London livery companies and wider-defence at our annual Affiliates Day. We were delighted to welcome so many affiliates to HMNB Portsmouth with a tour of HMS Prince of Wales prior to her major deployment this year and a private visit to HMS Victory. We are grateful for the support received from all our affiliates but a particular highlight this year was the awards sponsored by the Worshipful Company of Constructors, celebrating the success of our worthy winner, Sailor of the Term LCS Jack Harding.

Once redeployed, we were happy to keep the conversation going, so-to-speak, as the Constructor's Company Renter Warden, Sir Vivian Ramsey, was welcomed to Lancaster whilst he was visiting Muscat with his family in May 2025. The Commanding Officer was set the challenge to complete an Ironman (see p.14) whilst deployed, raising nearly £5000 for the Royal Navy Royal Marines Charity in the process. This effort was generously supported by so many of Lancaster's affiliate organisations, thank you.

August ushers in Starboard crew's return home but Port will take sole custodianship of Lancaster, who will continue to cherish the support from affiliates just as Starboard has throughout the ship's lifespan.

STARBOARD SEIZES £30M HAUL IN MAJOR DRUGS BUST

HMS Lancaster's Starboard crew achieved operational success early on this rotation as part of ongoing efforts to deter weapons and drugs smugglers in the region. After covertly tracking a suspect vessel through the Arabian Sea for more than 24 hours, the ship launched a coordinated sea and air operation to halt the dhow's journey.

Overhead, a Royal Marines sniper kept watch from our Wildcat helicopter as the Ship's Royal Marines Boarding Team, attached to Lancaster from 42 Commando, approached the vessel in a pincer formation. Supported shortly afterwards by Royal Navy Boarding Officers, the team uncovered 80 packages of illegal narcotics, which were transferred to Lancaster for testing before being safely disposed of.

The seizure included 1,000kg of heroin, 660kg of hashish, and 6kg of amphetamine — altogether worth an estimated £30 million on the UK market. This marks Lancaster's second major drug bust in three months following Port crew's success earlier this year. Maritime Interdiction Operations have been part of the Royal Navy's core business for centuries, highlighting the Royal Navy's crucial role in safeguarding maritime security and enforcing international law in the region.

Minister for the Armed Forces Luke Pollard thanked the 210 sailors and Royal Marines for their success.

"I congratulate the crew of HMS Lancaster on this significant seizure, which is keeping dangerous and illegal drugs off our streets. "This operation highlights the unique role our Royal Navy contributes, working to disrupt criminal operations around the world, keeping us secure at home and strong abroad."

12-DAY WAR: LANCASTER IN THE FIRING LINE DEFENDING COALITION INTERESTS

Entering her third year as the Royal Navy's forward deployed T23, sadly rising and falling regional tensions have become something of the norm for Lancaster and her crew. Indeed, the specific advantage of maritime forces are the poise and flexibility afforded by the high seas, mobile and ready to counter emerging threats. The middle three weeks in June 2025 proved a particularly stern test of our physical and mental readiness, as hostilities between Israel and Iran reached an unprecedented violent climax. As the sole major surface and air defence capable combatant in the vicinity, Lancaster put to sea and was placed at immediate notice to provide defence to Coalition force elements in the region, including minehunters HMS Bangor and HMS Middleton, as well as those of the US 5th Fleet.

Our mission was purely defensive in nature but striking the balance between credible deterrence and the very real

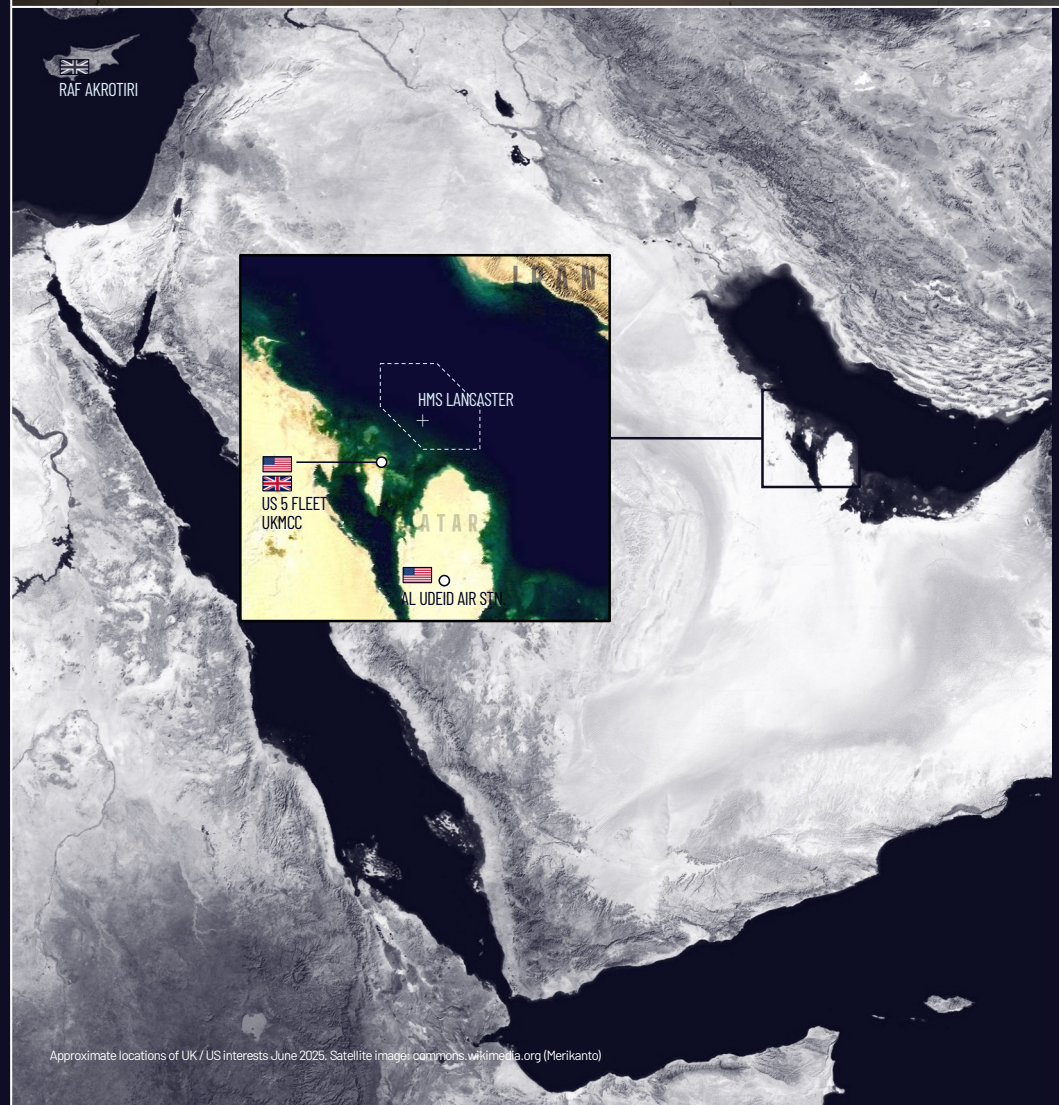
risk of miscalculation and escalation required focus and resilience from the entire Ship's Company.

In truth, given the geography of the region and our necessary positioning ahead of UK and US interests, the Ship was within the missile firing line on several occasions and witness to engagements over Qatar, luckily without ever being assessed to have been the intended target. Altogether, it was a rewarding if not draining high-on three weeks at Sea in an enhanced posture. The crew can be “proud of having done their duty”, as said by UK Maritime Component Commander Commodore Ben Aldous in an address delivered to the Ship's Company shortly after arriving in harbour.

Along with operations in the Red Sea and engagements with Houthi rebels yesteryear, HMS Lancaster has proved throughout her time in theatre the Royal Navy's capability to deliver high end warfighting. Most of all, her crew has shown professionalism and skill to deal with the intensity and pace of real-world operations.

CRICKET

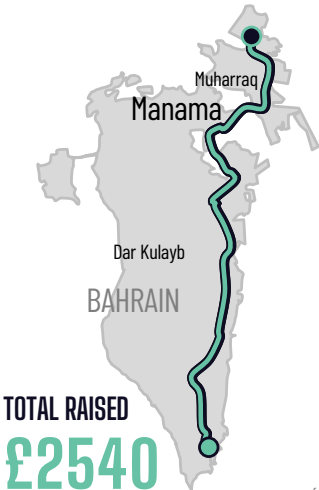
AB Kayleigh Martin received her first cap for the Royal Navy in June 25, at the annual Inter-Services T20 at Arundel Castle.

On the same day that AB McKenzie was completing his testing ultra marathon across Bahrain, the Commanding Officer was busy achieving his own athletic feat, as he completed a full Ironman distance triathlon on board. Commander Chew started at 0500, swimming from a pontoon near to the ship, supported by Ironman veteran MEO Lt Cdr Miles, who completed the swim with him. Next was the bike ride, conducted on Lancaster's flight deck with temperatures reaching a searing 35° even under an air-conditioned gazebo. Three hours and 180km virtual kilometres later with the cycle complete, Commander Chew moved to UK Naval Support Facility to

complete the marathon-distance run to finish in a total time of 11 hours 57 minutes. In the process, the CO raised over £4500 for the Royal Navy Royal Marines Charity.

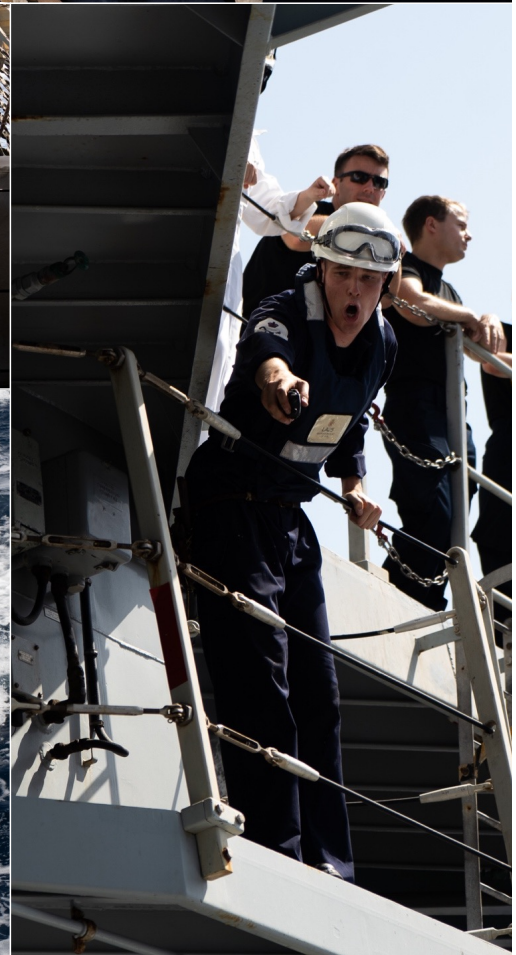

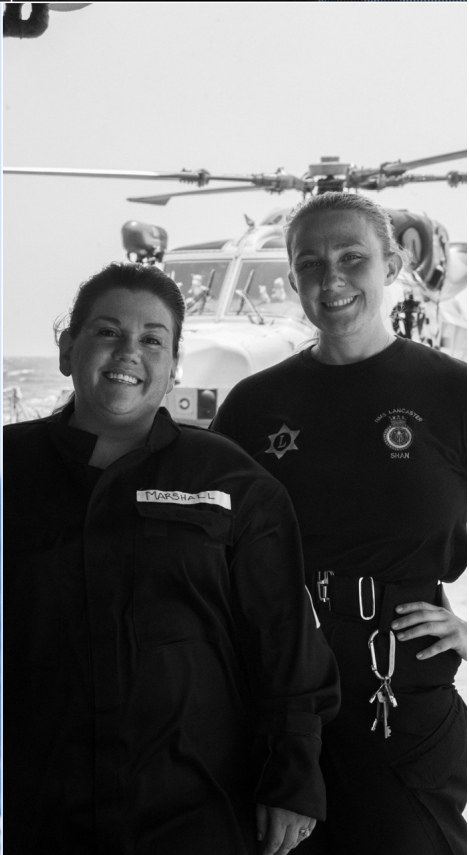
